RK suggested that we try breakfast on both Saturday and Sunday. CB asked if we would accept bids for the Sunday morning breakfast, which JS agreed. RK suggested we can also try coffee and donuts for Saturday morning. Doug Slygh suggested we try a local donut store to see if they'd want to submit a bid to supply the breakfast.
